The theme of the 3rd Black Women's Health Conference is *Matters of the Heart: Cardiovascular Disease, Health, and Healing*. We particularly seek proposals that conceptualize, interrogate, deconstruct, and report on issues related to cardiovascular functioning in conventional and emerging public health, social, political, legal, artistic, and historical contexts. We invite panel, poster, performance-based, and individual paper submissions on a wide range of topics that may include but are not limited to the following:

- Cardiovascular Disease;
- Obesity, Stress, and Morbidity;
- Heart Disease and Breast Cancer Risk;
- Exercise and Resilience;
- Self-Care;
- Access to Care;
- Romantic Relationships and Health;
- Humor, Happiness, and Health;
- Sexual Activity; and
- Family History and Risk.

We encourage submissions in a variety of forms, including: traditional academic conference papers and posters as well as proposals for panels, workshops, and roundtables from academics, independent scholars, practitioners, artists, activists, and community workers and organizers.
